Dear Jim:

I am writing as the attorney for the defendant in the above referenced cases.

As I indicated to you during our conversation of November 22, 1983, it is the FBI's position that -- given the recent denial of plaintiff's motion for reconsideration of the Court's April 28, 1983 award of expenses to the defendant in the amount of \$684.50 -- Mr. Weisberg is now required to remit that sum to the government forthwith. I am willing to give Mr. Weisberg a reasonable period of time to forward the money to us. However, I want to know by close of business, November 30, 1983, when he proposes to do so. If I do not here from you by then, I will assume, as you indicated was likely, that Mr. Weisberg does not intend to comply with the Court's Order of April 28, 1983. I will then have no alternative but to file further appropriate motions with the Court concerning your client's contumacious conduct. I sincerely hope that such will not be necessary.

If Mr. Weisberg decides, as he should, to comply with the Court's Order, his check should be made payable to the "Treasurer of the United States" and it should be sent to me.
