

An extra, so you can say there are many other illustrations like those you'll use, and because it is New Orleans. Plus the fact that I had provided copies of some of the defendant's lists of names to be searched in New Orleans, and weren't.

I've selected this particular one, which is one of those attached to the memo I sent you and Jim 3/21/85 (and there are others) because it contains no hint of the Walter Jenkins connection. No need to go into his troubles.

The case records is clear and unrefuted: I attested that I had provided several such lists, of which this may be one. Others also were disclosed to Allen.

With regard to the unsearched part of the New Orleans request relating to the Garrison investigation, these FBI ticklers disclose that the FBI knew who they are and had appropriate and undisclosed records. In a single tickler folder disclosed to Mark Allen there are five withholding sheets, each described by the FBI as related to "Garrison's Witnesses."

They needed no discovery from me (and I had provided it in any event and it was ignored) and no discovery from me would have enabled to to prove that they searched, which they hadn't, or had complied when they hadn't.
