
In a Rule 60(b) Motion to vacate a judgment obtained by the FBI against me in an FOIA lawsuit, C.A. 78-0322/0420 combined, I alleged fraud, misrepresentation and perjury to procure that judgment. In the FBI's Opposition to my Motion, to which you are signatory as United States Attorney, the FBI does not even deign to make pro forma denial of what I regard as serious charges, including felonies. I am filing a Response to this Opposition, along with a proposed Order to vacate that judgment.

If what I allege is true, and of this there is no reasonable question, then there has been official crime within your jurisdiction and I am writing to file this formal demand for prosecution.

In meeting your responsibilities, which I presume you will want to do, you face a conflict of interest from personal and office responsibility in what I allege is felonious. I therefore ask that you arrange for an impartial replacement of your office in this. From what I heard Mitch Snyder say recently, your office has recently had occasion to face this problem because of official false swearing of which he complained.

I am aging, unwell, limited in what I am able to do or afford, and my only regular income is Social Security of \$356 monthly; but if any information other than what I have filed in this litigation is desired, to the degree I can I will provide it.
