Dear Mark,

For your information and file I enclose my today's letter to di Genova with its attachments.

I found the enclosed xerox of a recent letter to me from a young college assistant professor I helped. I don't recall for whom I intended this copy and I send it merely to illustrate to you the degree to which I have tried to live up to what I believe FOIA requires of all requesters with all disclosed information. He had unsupervised access to my files and copier and I even arranged inexpensive local housing for him. And spent time with him. He did a good job.

I've not heard from Judge Smith. After two weeks this is rather surprising. He usually shoots (i.e., rubber-stamps) from the hip. Although I am not in any way familiar with the Rule or Rules governing a Motion to Reconsider, I do know that the 10-day limit begins the day it is filed by the court clerk. If they delay in mailing to me I have no recourse as I understand it and may not request an extension in time. So, my wife is now retyping what I've drafted in anticipation of his rejection, without pagination, so that I can do what I'll do as rapidly as possible after I get what he does.
