
Dear Mr. Moschella:




Enclosed for the Bureau, via Armed Forces Courier Service (AFCOS), are twelve (12) boxes containing the original and entire contents of 104 volumes or files of the cases detailed on the attached pages. Attached to each volume in each box is a serial inventory of that volume. Also enclosed in Box #12 is the original set of the serial inventory sheets in numerical order, along with the transmittal airtel.

AFCOS is scheduled to pick up the shipment of twelve (12) boxes on Thursday, 9/7/78, and estimates delivery to FBIHQ within five calendar days. The twelve (12) boxes have been wrapped and sealed in accordance with procedures for shipment of top secret material in custody of AFCOS.

All indexed references to all known individuals involved in or referred to in the investigation of the assassination of President JOHN F. KENNEDY were searched through search slips. From analysis of the search slips,

all cases in files separate from the main assassination file (89-69) were identified for inclusion in the serial inventory and shipment to FBIHQ. New Orleans retains the search slips and workpapers and is prepared to execute affidavit regarding the procedure utilized.

In review of the inventory sheets, New Orleans resolved the anomalies noted. Serials which were skipped, repeated or inserted were so noted. Serials which were removed to other files were also noted, and when the secondary file was not one included in the shipment its status was noted (destroyed or title of case).

For information of FBIHQ, the following summarizes the size and volume of these files. The twelve (12) boxes are all 14" X 14" X 10" and average about 30 pounds each. This equates to be about 23,500 cubic inches, and about 360 pounds. The volumes occupied about 21 feet of shelf space or the equivalent of about three, five-drawer cabinets.

Enclosed for the Bureau are five copies of a letterhead memorandum dated September 22, 1961, and captioned as above.

For the information of the Bureau, on the afternoon of 9/15/61, [redacted]

[redacted], Washington, D. C., personally called at the New Orleans Office and related that he was investigating the activities of a DAVID WILLIAM FERRIE, a former pilot for Eastern Airlines. [redacted] stated that it may be possible to take some action against FERRIE to keep him from flying commercial airplanes. [redacted] explained that a pilot case is presently under consideration involving an individual from Atlanta, Georgia, and that if a favorable ruling were received in such a case, that proceedings would also be taken by FAA against FERRIE.

[redacted] was furnished verbally with a summary of data contained in a preliminary investigation of DAVID WILLIAM FERRIE under a possible Neutrality Act investigation in September of 1961; however, as set forth in the enclosed letterhead memorandum, initial inquiries failed to indicate the existence of any neutrality act violation.

[redacted] was also advised that there were scattered references to FERRIE in the indices of this office, and that a memorandum would be prepared concerning all information in the New Orleans files regarding FERRIE, which memorandum would be furnished to Bureau headquarters at Washington, with the request that copies be furnished to the Security Division of FAA at Washington, D. C.

The above request is currently the subject of litigation and recently a review of the Kennedy assassination material by the Department of Justice has determined that the original search by New Orleans was properly conducted. However, the judgement by the Department in this appeal has raised some issues that need to be resolved. In furtherance of this New Orleans is requested to do the followings:

1. Conduct a new search on all subjects which were previously searched.
2. Send all material on these subjects which have accumulated in your office since the files were sent to Headquarters.
3. Conduct a search on George DeMohrenschildt and send any material located on this subject to Headquarters.
4. Conduct a search for "any official or unofficial administrative files which pertain to the Kennedy case" and if any are located, send to Headquarters.
5. Conduct a search for "files on "critics" or "criticism" of the FBI's assassination investigation" and if any are located, send to Headquarters.

Please be advised that numbers 4 and 5 above were not requested in referenced telephone call.

The following is set forth in response to Bucal of SCOTT KINSEY on 8/18/81:

Enclosed are 12 sheets containing copies of certain index cards from New Orleans indices, showing the indexed references, some of which were later determined to have been destroyed, in files pertaining to KENNEDY, OSWALD, GARRISON, and RUBY.

Also enclosed are 21 FD-478's, which document the regular destruction of those files. It is noted that a number of the indexed references pertaining to JIM GARRISON, in the indices search slips, dated 8/14/78, previously submitted to FBIHQ in this case, are now no longer maintained in the current New Orleans indices. This is because, after processing those references, Correlation Clerk JEAN B. HEARN, now retired, further correlated the index cards by eliminating entries thereon which had been determined to be destroyed. Nevertheless, the enclosed FD-478's positively document the proper destruction of those references so noted in the indices search slips.

In addition, one indexed reference for GARRISON, NO 80-505-198, was found to have been destroyed, since that control file re liaison with the Orleans Parish District Attorney's Office, although currently maintained as a file, had serials previous to #211 (Feb., 1974) destroyed.

In this regard, it is noted that JIM GARRISON was and is a wellknown public figure in New Orleans whose activities have been of interest to the public, media, and judicial community, totally divorced from the KENNEDY assassination and associated issues.

EXPLANATION OF EXEMPTIONS

SUBSECTIONS OF TITLE 5, UNITED STATES CODE, SECTION 552

- (b) (1) (A) specifically authorized under criteria established by an Executive order to be kept secret in the interest of national defense or foreign policy and (B) are in fact properly classified pursuant to such Executive order;
- (b) (2) related solely to the internal personnel rules and practices of an agency;
- (b) (3) specifically exempted from disclosure by statute (other than section 552b of this title), provided that such statute (A) requires that the matters be withheld from the public in such a manner as to leave no discretion on the issue, or (B) establishes particular criteria for withholding or refers to particular types of matters to be withheld;
- (b) (4) trade secrets and commercial or financial information obtained from a person and privileged or confidential;
- (b) (5) inter-agency or intra-agency memorandums or letters which would not be available by law to a party other than an agency in litigation with the agency;

- (b) (7) records or information compiled for law enforcement purposes, but only to the extent that the production of such law enforcement records or information (A) could reasonably be expected to interfere with enforcement proceedings, (B) would deprive a person of a right to a fair trial or an impartial adjudication, (C) could reasonably be expected to constitute an unwarranted invasion of personal privacy, (D) could reasonably be expected to disclose the identity of a confidential source, including a State, local, or foreign agency or authority or any private institution which furnished information on a confidential basis, and, in the case of a record or information compiled by a criminal law enforcement authority in the course of a criminal investigation, or by an agency conducting a lawful national security intelligence investigation, information furnished by a confidential source, (E) would disclose techniques and procedures for law enforcement investigations or prosecutions, or would disclose guidelines for law enforcement investigations or prosecutions if such disclosure could reasonably be expected to risk circumvention of the law, or (F) could reasonably be expected to endanger the life of physical safety of any individual;
- (b) (8) contained in or related to examination, operating, or condition reports prepared by, on behalf of, or for the use of an agency responsible for the regulation or supervision of financial institutions; or
- (b) (9) geological and geophysical information and data, including maps, concerning wells.

- (k) (6) testing or examination material used to determine individual qualifications for appointment or promotion in Federal Government service the release of which would compromise the testing or examination process;

The Dallas card index for the Kennedy Assassination reflects approximately 160 cards pertaining to photographs. However, none of the cards indicate a list compiled of the photographs obtained relative to the Kennedy files. The cards merely reflect the serial; FD-302, memo, airtel, etc., that refers to that particular photo; not the 1A exhibit location or Sub A location of the photo.

If FBIHQ desires, Dallas will xerox the 160 index cards. However, as stated above, they can not be considered a list to locating the photos themselves.

A search has previously been conducted of Dallas files 89-43, 100-10461 and 44-1639 for all films and tapes concerning the assassination of President Kennedy for a Freedom of Information-Privacy Acts (FOIPA) request. At that time the tape requested above was not located. On 4/20/81, employees of the FOIPA Section reviewed all documentation of the Dallas files concerning the radio calls. The results of this review indicate that the FBI never had a copy of the tape in its possession. On 4/22/81, employees of the Technical Services Division and FOIPA Section conducted a search of the enclosures behind file and bulky enclosures of files 62-109060 and 105-82555 for the tape. This search also failed to locate a copy of the tape.
