APPELLANT'S MOTION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME
WITHIN WHICH TO FILE BRIEF AND APPENDIX

Comes now the appellant, Mr. Harold Weisberg, and moves the Court for an extension of time, to and including April 10, 1981, within which to file his brief and appendix in this case. As grounds for his motion, appellant represents to the Court as follows:


1. Appellant's brief and appendix are presently due to be filed on March 10, 1981.
2. No previous request for an extension of time has been made.
3. The time that appellant's counsel can devote to this case is limited by the fact that he now works half-time for the firm of Fensterwald & Associates.
4. As a result of time commitments to cases which he is handling for Fensterwald & Associates, as well as to other of his own cases, appellant's counsel cannot complete the brief in this

case before he leaves the U.S. for a week on March 8, 1981.

5. The issue in this case concerns the award of attorney's fees under the Freedom of Information Act. Because of the importance of the issue, both to appellants and to the public, and because of the voluminous record in the case, a considerable amount of time will be required to write the brief and prepare the appendix.

Accordingly, for these reasons appellants respectfully request the Court to grant an extension of time within which to file his brief and appendix.
