On 11/6/63 [redacted] advised that at 10:20 AM ROSELLI was in his apartment and received a telephone call from an unknown individual. He told this person that he had been sleeping. He mentioned something about not being able to make this person's appointment. Source advised that after this call he heard ROSELLI up and moving around.

At 11:30 this date source stated that ROSELLI made a phone call to an unknown party. He told this party that the only way to do this was to go down and tell them the truth. That this person should take the receipt with him and show it to them. ROSELLI says that it is not the other people, it is you. When you leave things half undone that's what happens. ROSELLI inquired if this person had an appointment with the man and apparently he did. ROSELLI again told him to "take the consignment receipt of those dates and tell him that when you received these tickets you gave it to the man and that's what happened, but don't lie in any way, because if you lie and they catch you, it's your fanny and not his and if you haven't got the things to back it up, then it's just too bad."

Source stated that this conversation continued along the same lines for a few more minutes.

At 11:39 AM source advised that ROSELLI was talking to an individual named [redacted] (ph). They discussed politics. He says that something is nothing but trouble and that a man would be crazy to go there to take it for nothing. He mentioned something about communists and all kinds of things going on there. He says something about 9 billion places, Central America, etc.

ROSELLI says that he had attended the horse races at some unnamed track and had seen someone there. ROSELLI also told this person that he had looked at several apartment houses, however, he did not purchase any.

He told him to say hello to his family and also made the comment that he had been getting nothing but trouble from the Income Tax people and that was why he hadn't gone near anybody.

Source advised that at 11:43 AM ROSELLI received a telephone call from an unknown party. He told this party that he felt lousy and that she was just going out. He said he could see the doctor today for his cold and that he slept pretty good. He also told this individual that he would be at the club a little later.

Source advised that at 3:24 PM the telephone rang and was not answered.
