Thank you for your letter of April 20. My letter of April 6 was not intended, as you suggested, as a request for comment from your office; it was intended to be a renewal of my June 1976 request for all CIA records relating to the interception of mail to or from Lee Harvey Oswald and his wife.

If you insist, I suppose I can wait another month or two for all of these records, which I presume will be included in the general release on the Kennedy assassination. I understand that it would be quite time-consuming to route with a batch for references to the residue.

to review this batch for references to the mail interception.

However, I think it would be appropriate for you to provide me, in advance of the general release, with one document, which deals at least in part with this matter. This document is the CIA's letter of May 7, 1975 to the Rockefeller Commission, which is cited on page 59 of the Schweiker-Hart Report. This letter is CIA # ????-1087; that is, it was #1087 in the original numbering scheme, and I don't know what the full new number is.
