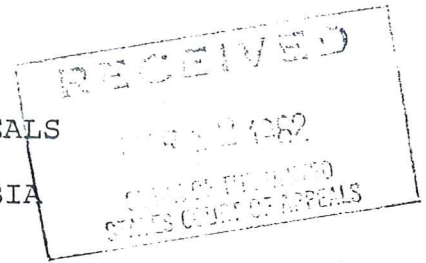

MOTION TO REDUCE NUMBER OF COPIES OF BRIEFS


1. Appellant is nearly 69 years old and in ill-health. His only regular income is a monthly social security check in the amount of \$312.90.

2. Appellant has been compelled to expend thousands of unrecompensed dollars in connection with the three previous appeals made to this Court during the twelve-year history of this litigation.

3. Should appellant prevail in this appeal, as he has in the past, he will be entitled to an award of costs against the Government. Thus, the taxpayers, as well as appellant, may ulti-

mately benefit from a reduction of the number of copies of briefs and appendix that he is required to file in this case.


