
MOTION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME TO RESPOND TO PLAINTIFF'S
MOTION FOR PERMISSION TO FILE A SUPPLEMENTAL BRIEF

The defendant appellee/cross-appellant U.S. Department of Justice respectfully moves for a ten day extension of time in which to respond to the recent motion filed by plaintiff appellant/cross-appellant Harold Weisberg which seeks permission to file a supplemental brief in the above-captioned appeals (which were argued on May 8, 1984). Our response to that motion is due on June 29, 1984; we seek a ten day extension of time in which to respond to the motion, to and including July 9, 1984.

The reason for this requested extension is that the Department of Justice attorney primarily responsible for the handling of these appeals, John S. Koppel, has been on leave

since June 15 and will not return to work until July 2. The Government, therefore, will not be in a position to ascertain its position concerning plaintiff's motion until Mr. Koppel's return. The additional time requested here will give Mr. Koppel one working week (less the day of July 4) in which to formulate his response to plaintiff's motion.
