As you can see, I'm working fast. If we have no bad weather I'll mail more tonight in time not to go to Baltimore.

You said something about legal research. I really wonder if that is actually your prime need in this case at this point? I think fact will control and we cannot run the risks of the past on what is so prejudicial in what they do.

You are going to be pressed for time, so please think this through. With all the lies they've told, you get bogged down in legal research that may not really be necessary at all and their lies will stand and no law citations can overcome that.

I think you should really ask for a judicial inquiry into the nature of the government's representations and their extensive misrepresentations and untruths.

See- I didn't say lie.

Later. I tried to get an early start and was working on this stuff at 5 a.m. I

left for a hasty breakfast that would not awaken Lil before 6:30, and had hardly gotten back to work when one of Lil's brothers came with a major problem and interruption about Lil's mother. So, I've done far from what I'd hoped by now and it is close to time for me to leave if I'm to make the outgoing mail and avoid Baltimore.

I'll keep going after supper, given no further interruptions, and will probably risk Baltimore with what I get done tomorrow, weather not making it unsafe. Prediction: sleet.
