TO RETARD BRIEFING SCHEDULE BY ONE WEEK

Comes now Harold Weisberg, Appellant/Cross-Appellee, and moves this Court to retard by one week the briefing schedule established by the Court's order of February 4, 1985. As grounds for his motion, Weisberg states to the Court as follows:


1. By sua sponte order of February 4, 1984, this Court directed the parties to brief two issues with respect to this Court's jurisdiction under the Tucker Act, 28 U.S.C. §§ 1346(a), 1295(a). The initial briefs are presently due on February 25, 1985, the reply briefs on March 7, 1985.

2. Weisberg's counsel leaves February 16, 1985 on a business trip to Asia which was planned before this Court's February 4, 1985 order was received. He will not return from this trip around the world until the evening of February 23, 1985. Thus, under the present briefing schedule his initial brief will be due the first working day after he returns from this exhausting trip.

3. Counsel for the Department of Justice has authorized counsel for Weisberg to state that the Department does not oppose this motion.

Accordingly, Weisberg requests that the date for filing initial briefs be retarded to March 4, 1985, and for reply briefs to March 14, 1985.


