Pursuant to General Rule 7(d), each appellant is required to file an original and three copies of a docketing statement within 20 days from the date this letter. If appellant does not intend to pursue this appeal, a motion to dismiss should be filed as soon as possible, and in any event not later than the date established for filing of the docketing statement.

Effective January 1, 1984, and pursuant to a general order of this Court, the Clerk of the District Court will not automatically transmit the record in civil cases on appeal to this Court. The time for filing appellant's brief ordinarily will not be less than 80 days from the date the case was docketed. That date is indicated above. The same time frames for briefing contemplated by the Federal Rules of Appellate Procedure will be applicable.

Your attention is directed to Rule 10 of the Federal Rules of Appellate Procedure concerning the preparation of any transcript deemed necessary. Docketing statements are to indicate the date upon which any transcripts were ordered.

A form for entering the appearance of counsel is enclosed. This form should be completed and returned to this office as soon as possible and in no event later than the filing of the docket statement.
