

As set forth in Dallas letter to the Bureau of 3/25/63, conditions promising a successful interview did not exist as of that time, thus justifying a "cooling-off period" prior to again making an effort to interview MARINA OSTALD. 



No information has been furnished to the Dallas Police Department by the Dallas Office on individuals with Subversive backgrounds in accordance with accepted Bureau policy in this regard that no information is to be furnished from our files to the other than approved representatives of executive agencies of the federal government, except to advise cooperating law enforcement agencies of data which are matters of public record.





Specifically, have we given Dallas Police any information concerning individuals and their subversive backgrounds?

There exists a situation of close liaison between the Special Services Bureau of the Dallas Police Department and the Dallas Office for exchange of information of mutual interest to both agencies with respect to racial matters and individuals identified with, or concerned with, the furtherance of the objectives of hate and klan-type organizations or activity. As provided in the Manual of Instructions, Section 1228 (Racial Matters), page 5, item 2, the Bureau has the responsibility of advising government agencies and officials on both a mational and local level of all pertinent information obtained concerning incidents in this category and each SAC is charged with the responsibility of seeing that necessary arrangements in this regard exist.

No information has been furnished to the Dallas Police Department by the Dallas Office on individuals with Subversive backgrounds in accordance with accepted Bureau policy in this regard that no information is to be furnished from our files to the other than approved representatives of executive agencies of the federal government, except to advise cooperating law enforcement agencies of data which are matters of public record.

(16) The Dallas Office has been furnishing the Dallas information concerning racial matters and individuals iging to hate and klan-type groups. In accordance with in instructions, no information has ever been furnished to hallas PD concerning individuals with subversive background.

This was felt warranted despite the information received shortly prior to that time to the effect LEE OSWALD had been in touch with the Boviet Embassy in Mexico City, since the investigation as reflected above established LEE OSWALD was in the U.S. in the Dallas would not have access to information important to the national
