QUOTE I SHOULD PERHAPS BEGIN BY EXPLAINING THAT THERE A LIMITATIONS ON CHIEF OFFICERS OF POLICE MAKING AVAILABLE INFORMATION OBTAINED BY THEIR OFFICERS IN THE COURSE OF CRIMINAL INVESTIGATIONS. CERTAIN INFORMATION WOULD, OF COURSE, BECOME PUBLIC KNOWLEDGE IN THE COURSE OF CRIMINAL CR, IN THIS CASE, EXTRADITION PROCEEDINGS BEFORE A COURT, BUT THERE IS NO RIGHT OF ACCESS TO INFORMATION HELD BY THE POLICE EVEN FOR MEMBERS OF PARLIAMENT IN THIS COUNTRY.

I SHOULD EMPHASISE, HOWEVER, THAT THERE CANNOT BE ANY PROSPECT OF THE COMMITTEE BEING GRANTED DIRECT ACCESS TO POLICE FILES. END QUOTE.
