Reference is made to your request to the Office of Naval Intelligence dated May 21, 1977 pursuant to the Freedom of Information Act.

On August 1, 1980, this Service received a copy of your request along with one Secret Service document.

Enclosed are copies of that Secret Service document which pertains to your request. It has had information deleted from it because it contains investigatory information compiled for law enforcement purposes. Pursuant to Title 5, United States Code, Section 552(b) (7)(C), (D), and (F), they have been exempted since disclosure would constitute an unwarranted invasion of personal privacy to other persons mentioned in the requested file, disclose the identity of a confidential source and/or information furnished by a confidential source, and endanger the Tife or physical safety of law enforcement personnel. Some deletions have been made in accordance with Title 5, United States Code, Section 552(b)(2) as information that pertains solely to the internal rules and practices of the agency. The citations of the above exemptions are not to be construed as the only exemptions which may be available under the Freedom of Information Act.

If you disagree with our determination, you have the right of administrative appeal within 35 days by writing to Freedom of Information Appeal, Deputy Director, U.S. Secret Service, 1800 G Street, N.W., Room 941, Washington, D.C. 20223.
