Dear Mr. Weisberg:

This is a partial response to your letter dated May 21, 1977 pursuant to the Freedom of Information Act for records concerning the assassination of President John F. Kennedy.

The attached documents which were found in our file numbered 129-11, sections 25 through 32 are being made available to you in full or in part. A copy of the schedule of documents which covers sections 25 through 32 is also enclosed. The Freedom of Information Act exemptions which apply to the documents released in part are 5 U.S.C. 552(b):

- (5) Intra-agency correspondence which reflects the deliberative processes of the Department;
- (7) Investigatory records compiled for law enforcement the disclosure of which would:
 - (C) Constitute an unwarranted invasion of the privacy of a third party.

Some of the original pages of items 1307 and 1338 in our file have been partly cut off.

Some of the pages of items 1346, 1382, 1383, and 1384 are the best copies we are able to make. These pages in our file are themselves duplicates of poor quality, and therefore difficult to reproduce.

We are presently reviewing another series of sections of file 129-11. The review of these sections will be completed as soon as possible.

Pursuant to Department regulations, you have a right to appeal the deletions as a partial denial of your request. This appeal must be made within thirty days in writing and addressed to the Associate Attorney General (Attention: Office of Information and Privacy Act Appeals) Department

of Justice, Washington, D.C. 20530. The envelope and letter should be clearly marked, "Information Appeal". If on appeal your request is denied, judicial review will thereafter be available to you in the district in which you reside or have your principal place of business or the district in which the records denied to you are situated or the District of Columbia.
