NOVEMBER 22, 1963

On 7/2/75, Supervisor [REDACTED] Freedom of Information Section, FBI HQ telephonically advised as follows: b7c

Former security patrol clerk of the New Orleans Division WILLIAM S. WALTER has submitted a request to the Bureau for a copy of his personnel file under the Freedom of Information Act. WALTER, who resigned in 1966, was involved in captioned case, to the effect that after leaving the Bureau he allegedly made statements to Attorney, MARK LANE, who at that time was investigating the KENNEDY assassination that while WALTER was employed as a security clerk on or about 11/16-17/63 he received a teletype from the Bureau in which statements were made that an attempt would be made on the life of President KENNEDY during his upcoming trip to Texas. After the Bureau became aware of statements made by WALTER he was subsequently interviewed by BuAgents during 1968 and it is believed a signed statement was taken from him at that time. [REDACTED] requested that efforts be made to locate the signed statement in the files of the New Orleans Division and any other information that may not be in the possession of the Bureau concerning WALTER's activities at this time. b7c
