
Pursuant to this Subcommittee's oversight jurisdiction over the Justice Department, I hereby request that Mr. Robert Fink, a Professional Staff Member of this Subcommittee, be briefed by Deputy Associate FBI Director James B. Adams, on the FBI's investigation into the allegations made by former FBI clerk, William S. Walter.

I am particularly interested in Mr. Fink being supplied with a copy of a 1968 FBI investigation relevant to Mr. Walter, as well as a copy of an FBI teletype message sent from Washington to all field offices on the evening of November 22, 1963, at, I believe, 9:22 P.M. EST, to the effect that the assassination of President Kennedy may have been a conspiracy.

I wish this briefing to be conducted no later than Thursday, October 16, 1975. If Mr. Adams is not available during this time, his deputy, Mr. Paul Mack, who I understand is knowledgeable about this matter, shall be acceptable. He should telephone Mr. Fink directly, to establish a mutually convenient time.
