This is in reply to your letter dated Felruary 25th, which was received in my office on February 27th, regarding certain spectrographic analyses performed in connection with the investigation relating to the assassination of former President John P. Kennedy.

The results of these spectrographic tests are contained in an PBI report dated November 30, 1963, at lallas, Texas, which has been furnished to the National Archives, and is available to the public. Additionally, the results are set forth in the report of the Warran Commission, Volume 5, pages 67, 69, 73, and 74, wherein it is specifically stated that the metal fragments were analyzed spectrographically and were found to be similar in composition.

We are therefore of the opinion there has been full disclosure of the results of our testing in this fegard, and it is available to the public as outlined above.
