Dear Mr. Weisberg:

This is a further partial response to your letter dated May 21, 1977 pursuant to the Freedom of Information Act for records concerning the assassination of President John F. Kennedy.

The attached documents which were found in our file numbered 129-11, sections 37-38 and enclosures two through nine are being made available to you in full or in part. A copy of the schedule of documents which covers sections 37-38 and enclosures two through nine is also enclosed. Additional documents were also located in our file numbered 129-11. These documents are listed on pages 73C - 73E of the attached schedule. The review of items 1400, 1413-1415, and 1456-1459 has been completed. These documents are included in the attached package except for a two page attachment to item 1414. The Freedom of Information Act exemptions which apply to the documents released in part are 5 U.S.C. 552(b):

- (2) Related solely to the Internal Personnel Rules and practices of an agency;
- (6) [Documents the disclosure of which would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of the privacy of a third party];
- (7) Investigatory records compiled for law enforcement the disclosure of which would:
 - (C) Constitute an unwarranted invasion of the privacy of a third party; or
 - (D) Reveal the identity of confidential sources, or information furnished solely by confidential sources.

The attachment to item 1414 is a two page draft of a letter from the Deputy Assistant Attorney General to the Staff Director of the Senate Select Committee to study governmental operations with respect to intelligence activities. Access to the document is denied to you pursuant to 5 U.S.C. 552(b)(5) [Inter-agency correspondence which reflects the deliberative processes of the Department]. We are presently reviewing another series of sections of file 129-11. The review of these sections will be completed as soon as possible.

Pursuant to Department regulations, you have a right to appeal the partial denial of your request. This appeal must be made within thirty days in writing and addressed to the Associate Attorney General (Attention: Office of Information and Privacy Act Appeals) Department of Justice, Washington, D.C. 20530. The envelope and letter should be clearly marked, "Information Appeal". If on appeal your request is denied, judicial review will thereafter be available to you in the district in which you reside or have your principal place of business or the district in which the records denied to you are situated or the District of Columbia.
