Dear Mr. LeBar:

This is in reply to your letter of January 22th, addressed to Mr. Lawrence Sherman of the Department of Justice, and thereafter referred to me and received on February 10th.

I wish to state in response to your inquiry that FBI records contain no information to indicate your client, Mr. Weisberg, has been the subject of FBI surveillance. These records further do not disclose any reference to dissemination by us of information concerning either his criticism of the Warren Commission along the lines you indicated in your letter.

With regard to your request for reference to letters directed by Mr. Weisberg to former Attorney General McClellan, our records reveal a copy of a letter dated March 12, 1969, had been referred to us, it having been forwarded by the then Asst. Atty. Gen. McClellan on or about date of March 13, 1969. The charges contained in the letter were general and made no specific allegations, and there is no record of further action being taken.

In a second letter, located in files of the Department of Justice under date of March 22, 1971, Mr. Weisberg alleged in non-specific terms that he had drafted a letter "tailed" to New Fulton, New York. These records contain no reference to this letter.
