





New York City. He stated that he had returned to the US on 1-12-61

from Cuba via MM, after which he resided in New York City(NYC)

until August 1961. Since the latter date he has been living
in NO.

He explained that he had become friendly with a university proffessor Jose Ignacio Rosco some time a o in Guba. Rosco had been a professor at the . of Havana and in 1959 formed a movement against Castro. In '59, Rosco Davis told Rosco that he would like to become a member of his movement in Guba but about a week later Rosco and his grour "went unde groud"

Davis went to NYC from Cuba in 1/61. In MYC he became acquainted with friends of his active in the Christain Democratic Movement (CDM) (MDC). He was a coordinator between this group and the NYPD.. Davis is definitely anti-Castro.

Guatemala Lumber and Mineral Corporationwhich has the conturact to take mahogany out of Guatemala. Davis contacted Laureane Batista, sho happens to be connected with the D in MM, to have Batista get some men to work for him in thei lumber company in Guatemala. Per Pavis, 19 men were sent to No by Batista. These men came from MM. These emensare under the misconception that they were to go to a training camp in MO and then sent to Guatemala for a ditional training.

Davis claims that when the men were told of the real purpose of their being contacted by Batista, they were disappointed. Davis stated that these men were dres ed in military type clothing and it was necessary for him to buy them civilian clothing.

Davis stated that during the latterpart of July the FBI seized some dynamite and other explosives stored in material. Lacombe, La, about a mile from Highway 190. According to the newspapers, this material was to be used against Cuba. Davis stated that the 19 men sent from MM were sent back to MM by the Guatemalan Lunber Co. in view of the fact that the man were not willing to work for the lunber company.

Davis also stated that the is the delegate m in NO for the MDC but has not done anything specific in this capacity.
