Re my 5/2/80 FOIA request of 5/2/80 and 8/6/80 appeal: Not long thereafter  
was the first of my surgeries & subsequent limit it at mos & I'd forgotten this. I recall  
no response - ever from anyone. Rereading this tells me that the request is for  
historically important information and that the real reason for nonresponse is  
That if the government were to have disclosed the requested information  
the government would have been seriously embarrassed. It was engaged in  
a political rather than historical - disclosure operation. The obvious result - am  
I believe intent - of which was and continues to be the suppression of seriously  
embarrassing information by cont nothing what could not be known &  
by the knowing by false pretense that its general disclosures referred to  
were full & complete. They were not and they to this day are not, believe me  
with the passing of time this deliberately suppressed - after request - information is of  
even more significance. Because doing any thing at all is now beyond my  
physical capabilities, I would appreciate it if you would join me in this  
request & if necessary, file suit, so that this in turn at least may be available.

I had been hospitalized before the form acknowledgement of receipt was made  
with regard to the Nov 1980 request records you sent, of 1975, this was addressed  
to NTRS & referred to the FBI which promptly ignored all but one page, the rest & all  
being without response, I filed two subsequent FOIA requests of the FBI, and in  
the relatively recent past I provided a 1978 appeal. I have received only a few  
months, a couple of months ago, my renewal of this 1978 appeal.  
was given a 1985 number last year. I received no response to my complaint  
& request that it be handled in proper chronological sequence other  
than another non-responsive fax form letter persisting in the 1985  
number for a 1978 appeal (I think you should provide these things  
so judge for yourself).

as soon as it warms up a bit I'm going to see if my office, which has two outside
