



Philadelphia, Pennsylvania March 12, 1964

On March 11, 1964, between three and four hundred people attended a meeting sponsored by the Friends of the National Guardian and held at the Philadelphia Ethical Society auditorium, 1906 Rittenhouse Square, Philadelphia, Pa. The auditorium was overcrowded and people were standing in the vestibule.

The meeting was billed as a public inquiry into
the OSWAID case and took place about 8:30 p.m., featuring MARK
LANE, described as a civil libertarian, a leader in the New
York Reform Democrats, a former member of the New York State
Legislature, and the attorney retained by Frs. MARGURRITE
OSWAID, LRE OSWAID's mother. Over three hundred people paid
\$1.00 each for admission and approximately \$200 additional
was collected.

A. HARRY LEVITAN was Chairman of the affair and DAVID DAVIS appeared to be in charge. MARK LANE spoke and gave various information to cause a great deal of doubt as to whether LEE HARVEY OSWALD was guilty of the assassination of President KENNEDY. He accused the FRI and Dallas Police of withholding evidence and accused the Becret Service of not doing a real thorough job of protecting the President. He

had photographs of testimony of OSWAID taken while he was in prison. He pointed out discrepancies in this testimony. He said that the Dallas Police said the rifle was one make and the PBI said it was another make. Also, that the doctor who examined the President after he was shot changed his story as to the direction from which the bullet entered the President's body.

The said also there were questions he could not answer now. One applied to JACK RUBY, which he could not answer due to RUBY's trial. The other information was given to the Warren Commission and had to do with the meeting of three men after the President was shot and before OSWAID was shot. The information in general was the same as that furnished by IANE on radio and was effective in convincing the people present that there was doubt as to the guilt of OSWAID. There was a standing ovation and the audience applauded for approximately ten minutes at the conclusion of his talk.

torium. Also, MARK LANE spoke on Radio Station WPEN from about 12:10 to 12:50 a.m., March 12, 1964.
