Dear Mr. Lesar:

In processing the Freedom of Information Act request of your client, Mark Allen for records about the House Select Committee on Assassinations, the F.B.I. located five documents which originated with the Criminal Division of the Department of Justice and referred those documents to us for our review and direct response to you.

Items 1-2 are being released to you in their entirety. Items 3-5 are being released to you with deletions. These deletions have been made in accordance with the following exemptions of the Freedom of Information Act (5 U.S.C. 552(b)):

- (6) Documents which if disclosed would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of the personal privacy of a third party; and,
- (7) Investigatory records compiled for law enforcement purposes which if disclosed would:
 - (C) Constitute an unwarranted invasion of the personal privacy of a third party.

Pursuant to Department regulations, you have a right to appeal the deletions as a partial denial of your request. This appeal must be made within thirty days in writing and addressed to: Assistant Attorney General, Office of Legal Policy (Attention: Office of Information and Privacy) United States Department of Justice, Washington, D.C. 20530. The envelope and letter should be clearly marked, "FOIPA Appeal". If on appeal your request is denied, judicial review will thereafter be available to you in the district in which you reside or have your principal place of business or the district in which the records denied to you are located or the District of Columbia.
