In your 7/18/79 affidavit in the Feinman case and the attached letter to him of the same date, which I presume you sent in response to my appeal relating to the unsearched AG and DAG files, you confirm that those files have been located. My appeal was from the denial of the records pertinent in both cases.

This is the first word I've had in several years. The last I heard from your office was from Ms. Linda Robinson, who told me that neither files had been located. She presumed that all AGs and DAGs ^Fstipped their offices when they left, interpreting all records as personal records. I disputed this.

You confirm to Feinman that records relating to Department components are not removed by these officials when they leave office.

The records withheld from me, records that to the best of my knowledge have not been looked for in four years, are those you say are not removed from the Department's files.

In addition, the information Feinman seeks relates to CBS, so a search in belated response to his request would not be a search in response to mine, which in both cases are broad and inclusive.

Can there now be another belated search, in response to my requests?

Perhaps other records of this general nature are the subject of 62-³33925. This number is noted on a record in the HQ Ruby file, copy in 62-109060. The record is a Belmont to Tolson memo of 11/24/63. It relates to a conversation between President Johnson and Director Hoover having to do with the JFK assassination. Any records of any such conversations having to do with either assassination are relevant to my requests, which are not limited to either MURKIN or the three JFK-related HQ files from which records have been provided.
