ASSASSINATION OF PRESIDENT
JOHN FITZGERALD KENNEDY,
DALLAS, TEXAS, 11/22/63

A confidential source who has furnished both reliable and unreliable information in the past requested that an agent of the FBI contact him at Orleans Parish Prison where this individual is confined following conviction for simple burglary. The confidential source was contacted on April 13, 1967 and advised that several weeks ago he talked with Bundy, who is a fellow prisoner and is the same person who testified that he saw Clay Shaw pay past money to someone on the Lakefront. Bundy indicated that he had been offered a deal by District Attorney Jim Garrison if he would testify to a story about Shaw. According to the source, this conversation allegedly took place several weeks ago in Orleans Parish Prison prior to the time Bundy testified at the hearing in the Orleans Parish Criminal District Court for Clay Shaw. At that time Bundy was undecided what course of action he would pursue but told the source and others that he would do anything to get out of his sentence. Bundy indicated in no way words without coming out and stating directly that his testimony was not true and a story was given to him to tell.

This source further advised he had been approached by Salvatore Panzeca and Bob Wilson regarding testifying to the above information on behalf of Clay Shaw. Panzeca is a member of the firm representing Shaw.

This source further advised that in approximately January, 1967, Lynn Loisel, a member of Garrison's staff, drove him down Dauphine Street in New Orleans, and pointed out a white house with a red door. Loisel asked the source if he could get into the house, put something in the house and get out without being detected. The source declined to do this. The source was told by Loisel that this had something to do with the Kennedy assassination and that the residence pointed out was that of Clay Shaw. The confidential source said he was not told what he was to do in the house or what he was to place in the house.

This source claimed he was given the District Attorney's Office confidential telephone number 822-2134, however, this number was later changed and he was given the present number 822-0504, which he was to use in contacting the District Attorney's Office.
