Dear S. FOIC, I have received your 7/26/68 and the enclosures referred to in the.

Once again I will file a copy with Mr. Shaw as my agent. However, when there are records that are believed to not be relevant or exculpatory, it does seem to be an unnecessary burdening of the government and unproductive usage of staff.

Because of this reason, which addresses these new matters of more than usual interest, I submit from the very few to which I have made,

These appear to refer to Mr. Garrison and his unnamed prints. As such the author(s) are also within my FOIA 70-2004, for FBI New Orleans office records, of which Mr. Shaw has knowledge.

#1064 is a routing slip that appears to refer to a classifying tape. The names of those to whom the starting report(s) went are of those whose names appear regularly pertaining to Garrison. (125-41 section 22)

The initial handwritten message for #1064 is written a possibility that, Doug was at FBI New Orleans and he had sent a "holder" on top of this to (undesignated name) Mr. Murray - but that his personal question was it was too dangerous to request an of tape, contact Negro or some editor as they are doing nothing at this time. It's not inclined to req. FBI to do anything on this, I'll give their (FBI) grouping will feed us some details soon." On order the last sentence, in the subject, in FC ages E."

Routing by a desk man to Director Hoover appears to be a bit unusual and does suggest significance, out of the ordinary.

The combined references to Negro and some editor suggests a New Orleans reporter and newspaper. At that time the States-Item had a reporter named Take May, who was often called Negro. At that time also he was having contact with a senior FBI employee. By age he could have been her father. The last time I saw him he was with her. He was antisocially drunk. In his drunk state he reflected a different attitude toward Garrison, a decidedly antipathetic one. Both papers were strongly opposed to Garrison.

As I have informed Mr. Shan in the past, there were what amounted to anti-Garrison portion in the FBI's office. I have the notes of a reporter who was present.

Whether or not any of this is pertinent, there is no record included in what you have provided that refers to any such tape or to anything that could have been the subject of this meeting; all,

1034 (Section 213) refers to File 145-12-979. This file has not been provided. It also refers to the existence of an index you have not provided or referred to. An other handwritten note refers to a filing by subject matter rather than file number. Any subject files would be of particular interest and importance.

Written on at the top is "714510 Box 7D." If this refers to other filing I ask that it be checked for compliance.

This particular record was addressed to the Civil Division and bears its stamp. It therefore is possible that the notations are by that division.

The other routing slips, also both initially directed to Mr. Block, indicate that he had a special role in what 1016 (Section 213) refers to as "Garrison's Police." 1019 indicates that he kept what is referred to as "your diary," which would be an important record of this "follies." No such diary has been provided or referred to in anything you have provided. Both records refer to a "B & A Room file" and a "B & A Room case." In neither instance is what was recorded provided.

I don't know what the B & A file or case is but I do recall that there was considerable attention to Garrison's purchase of a home, the price he paid and the size of his mortgage. A source to which there was no attribution provided this information to the press.

1019 indicates where the original was directed.

Show Garrison's wills and what the Department and the FBI did and did not do about them are of considerable historical importance. Like the earlier records you have provided, these refer to many records not provided or accounted for in any way. They are pertinent and I would like copies of them.
