Dear Mr. Weisberg:

This is in response to your letter dated August 4, 1980, concerning Civil Division records not provided and certain other matters, a copy of which is enclosed for your convenience.

From the content of your letter, I assumed you were referring to John F. Kennedy assassination records, but Civil Division personnel have informed me that they have no record of ever having received such a request from you. They believe that you are referring to your Privacy Act request. If you wish to pursue this matter further, I suggest that you write directly to the Civil Division, specifying the records you seek, the date of your initial request, and the reasons you believe the Division has responsive records it has not provided to you.

With regard to the other matters raised in your letter, they will be handled as part of the actions on your appeals involving Kennedy records of the Criminal Division, Bureau Headquarters and the New Orleans Field Office.
