To Quin Egan from Harold Weisberg, PA, JFK records appeals 6/15/80

How my correspondence with HIS reached the office of BOUSA and why it referred that BOUSA correspondence to Criminal Division is as mysterious to me as the fact that neither component provided these and related records in response to my requests or to your readers.

Why these two letters and not the rest of the correspondence? Why HIS and not other agencies? Why the United States Attorney's office in the Department and not, initially, other components? Why refer to Criminal Division? Was prosecution of me for some fancied criminal act contemplated? If so, how did the BOUSA know?

In what way does any of this conform to the functions and responsibilities of BOUSA - if at all?

This appears to be so unusual I hope you can address it reasonably soon.

The request and first appeal are of 1976.

Please note the absence of any "departmental file identifications" when those letters went to BOUSA, thence to Criminal, thence back to BOUSA again, at the least. This does not appear to be usual.
