Reference Mr. Branigan to Mr. Sullivan memorandum 12/19/63 recommending that Liaison make appropriate contacts with Internal Revenue Service (IRS) and other Government agencies which might logically have pertinent information concerning Oswald and Ruby.

On 12/24/63, Mr. George Gaffney, Bureau of Narcotics, furnished SA Putnam the attached memorandum setting forth a 1946 interview of Jack Ruby concerning a narcotics matter.

On 12/19/63, Mr. William McCarthy, IRS, was requested to furnish available income tax returns on Oswald, Jack Ruby, Earl R. Ruby, Samuel David Ruby, Mrs. Dyan L. Grant, Michael Ralph Paine and Ruth Avery Paine, as well as any other pertinent information in IRS files on Oswald and Jack Ruby. TEXAS

Lieutenant Joseph Wubboid, U. S. Coast Guard, Lieutenant Colonel James H. Nix, Jr., U. S. Army; and Mr. David Ellis, Bureau of Customs, advised SA Putnam that they either had no pertinent information concerning subjects or the information was previously furnished the FBI.

SA Haynes contacted Mr. William Bowling, Small Business Administration and Mr. James T. Murphy, Federal Aviation Agency, both of whom advised their agencies have no information concerning subjects. Mr. John Harrington, Federal Communications Commission, is currently checking licensing records concerning subjects. William H. Morse, Immigration and Naturalization Service, advised there is no reference to subject Ruby in their records. Information concerning Oswald has

Mr. Leonard Bienvenu, National Security Agency, and Mr. Robert Emond, U. S. Information Agency, both advised SA McDonnell their agencies have no reference to subject.

Mr. Victor Ray, Post Office Department, and Mr. Blake Turner, Veterans Administration, both advised SA O'Connor their records are negative concerning subjects.

Mr. Charles Sither, Office of Special Investigations, Air Force, furnished SA O'Connor two memoranda dealing with Oswald and Ruby, which are attached.

Mr. Ritchey Williams, Civil Service Commission, and Commander Lee Jordan, Office of Naval Intelligence, advised SA Keenan that they have no information concerning the subjects not already furnished to the Bureau.

The records of the Central Intelligence Agency are being checked on a continuing basis by SA Papich.

ACTION:

Liaison will secure results of record checks with IRS and Federal Communications Commission. Contact will be maintained with CIA for any additional pertinent information concerning subjects.
