de are in receipt of a referral from the VBI dated foril 10, 1977, directing our attention to paragraph three of returned to the VBI dated October 27, 1975, for copies of retarials which you furnished to the FBI concerning the Silver Chirts and david DuBois Hayne.

The F3I informed you by letter dated April 14, 1977, that The materials you furnished were transmitted to the Department of Justice on Fobruary 17, 1940 in the case entitled "David DuBois Layness" The naterials. A search in the name of David DuBois Mayne reflects five Criminal Division Coursents pertaining to the materials. Those chousents indicate that the materials were returned to the F3I on Force 6 and Farch 7, 1940. Copies of the five Coursents are enclosed to have reflected your request back to the F3I for further response to you.

Le are also in receipt of your letter dated Foril 20, 1977, suggesting that in processing your request for records each yourself one chould have located records concerning you in connection with the one writter, the case of U.S. V. Mary Helen, and several other matters. Thread several other matters, the case of U.S. V. Mary Helen, and several other matters. Thread for records about the several other matters. Thread is processed, only requires search in the name of the requester. As we indicated in our letter dated April 15, 1977, search in your name did not reflect any records pertaining to you.

Records Thomas - 1134 Main FOI Unit - 312 FTB Hold Nevertheless, in accordance with your April 20, 1977, letter and the referral from the FBI, we have now searched, pursuant to the Freedom of Information Act, in the name of David DuBois Mayne. As indicated above, we have located the five abovementioned documents pertaining to you. In addition, in accordance with your letter of April 20, 1977, we have searched under U.S. v. Mary Helen. That search did not reflect any records. The other matters which you set forth in your letter do not reasonably describe the records sought, as required by the Freedom of Information Act, since your descriptions of the records fail to provide information sufficient for search.

Regarding your reference to interviews of you and your wife by the FBI in connection with the Alger Hiss case, you are further advised that we have already reviewed all Criminal Division documents which we have been able to locate, in processing another nequest. We recall no reference to you or your wife in those documents. The approximately 500 pages of such documents are, however, available to you at \$.10 per page, if you wish copies.

Finally, we note your question regarding the June 10, 1966, memorandum from the Deputy Archivist to Marion M. Johnson. Our records reflect that the National Archives and Records Service consulted with the Department of Justice regarding the releasability of the document. On November 19, 1976, we advised the Office of Legal Counsel-which was coordinating the consultation for the Justice Department-that the Criminal Division had no objection to the release of the document. You should direct any further inquiry regarding the matter to the National Archives and Records Service.
