SUBJECT: EMORY L. BROWN, JR.  
FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT

This is in reply to your letter under the above caption dated July 27, 1970, with enclosures.

An analysis of the material sent to you by Mr. Emory L. Brown, Jr., reveals that Mr. Brown is interested in obtaining access to records reflecting results of investigation concerning the "suspect individuals" mentioned in Warren Commission Exhibits 705 and 1974. The "suspect individuals" pertaining to the assassination of President John Fitzgerald Kennedy emanated from certain radio transmissions of the Dallas, Texas, County Sheriffs Office and the Dallas Police Department on November 22, 1963.

Referenced letter asked for comments of the FBI concerning Mr. Brown's request. To obtain the data Mr. Brown is interested in, would require a considerable amount of research into voluminous FBI files concerning the assassination of President Kennedy. We do not have sufficient personnel to conduct the necessary research to comply with requests of this type; therefore, no further action is being taken in this matter.
