The material consists of the articles of incorpor ation of a <u>Committee to Investigate Assassinations</u>, Inc.; a partial list of prospective directors and members; and a resume of Bernard Fensterwald; Jr.

My friend advises that Fensterwald together with a woman named Sandy had been making contact in Dallas with witnesses and others who might be knowledgeable about the John F. Kennedy assassination. Fensterwald represented himself as acting for a Committee to Investigate Assassinations, Inc., and created the impression that he and his group were anxious to find some new evidence or statements that would tend to contradict the conclusion of the Warren Commission.
