At the time of FBI EQ testimony before the Warren Commission this was a separate file. By them at least a large proportion of the later records had been Agenerated.

Alem H. Belmont testified that some of the file was security classified. (5811 ff.) He offered to leave that file with the Commission but Warran did not want that because of the alleged security content. (Not that its records do not hold many files marked TOP SECRET.)

As of that time the so-called Oswald Headquarters file was a separate file if

this tastimony can be believed.

Beliabut treated it that way. I believe this meens more than if the Commission had. But the Commission also did.

The Fal's list of Oswald records, Commission Schibit 834, provides no backs for any apprehension over the file itself. Little was classified and only one record was as high in classification as SECRET. It is all public, the "secret" stuff.
