FBI pre-FOIA willingness to disclose informants and confidential sources.

Attached are two FBIHQ memos which bear no identifiable serial numbers. They are of June 8 and 30, 1964.

Both reflect the willingness of the FBI, including with an "OK F" approval of the Director, to disclose the names of symbolled informants and confidential sources, even though the FBI regarded the information sought as not relevant to the work of the Warren Commission.

These records also refer to Dallas records that were not provided in C.A. 78-0322, the relevant files on some political groups that were involved in the investigations.

"...there was no reluctance whatsoever on the part of the Bureau to make the reports available," it is stated, even though they "contain the names of some individuals not the subjects of current investigation as well as the names of some of our confidential sources...which could result in the exposure of our confidential sources."

This, of course, is quite inconsistent with FBI representations of later period, after FOIA.

No files on any of the mentioned political groups has been made available from the Dallas records. The Cuban groups, of both sides, were relevant to the Commission's work and have been found to be relevant in all subsequent official investigations.

The Communist records do not interest me because, as the FBI states, Oswald, the alleged "red," had no connection. (For your information, while the FBI states it had only nine names and not all of those were members, my sources, who include those who had informants planted inside, state that there were only six members, including the informants.)
