The attached records, Case 120-41, are from Criminal Division.

On 12/6 the same handwritten notation used to indicate other files to be searched,  
the "See further at the back and the witness 'will' section at the bottom. The subject  
matter is a civil suit to obtain the Oswald rifle, purchased by King. Unless there is  
significant evidence pertaining to this litigation, it is my belief that what has been  
disclosed about this litigation is complete.

In 1957 there is also note to the rear, both hand. Nottingham was general counsel.  
DePoebeauville (Paul) was director of AEC laptop developments. He wrote AEC Criminal offering  
help in neutron activation analysis of the JMK evidentiary materials. This and his  
correspondence are included in my Case 120-226, just number for at least the 11th time.  
The only copy provided to me of one deposed letter is unclear. No pertinent documents  
have been provided.

No deposed's letter nor extract of the FBI's report to the President, letter to Mr.  
Harold Rosenthal document 1, which is disclosed, the (b)(6) claim you made without basis,  
apparently to withhold his pertinent and critical comments on the FBI's classification  
despite the non-classified nature of that report. (In apparently, in 1954, I wrote and  
published similar criticisms.) Is this kind of (b)(6) claim I have no mind to  
Criminal Division and other records.

Harold Johnson, who wrote the note, is a DDCI member who also is a lawyer.

The second paragraph of 120-6 refers to the withholding of records that are pertinent  
in the request being presented and to O.A. 75-226. The reference to the 1/27/64 executive  
session transcript may be pertinent to my ds request. I used to obtain that transcript  
(O.A. 2050-73) and I published it in full in *Frontline* in 1973. The content, non-existent,  
is embarrassing to the FBI and the CIA.

Mr. Tamm, M.D. is an O.C. friend & believes it was not unusual in compliance with  
any S/AB/71 request. In practice he regards all records of the review of individual Gurdian records  
to a large degree, and withheld records were disclosed. It was apparent that there were no  
real basis for the withholding. In many instances they might be attributed to a lack of  
~~knowledge~~ or the parts of the records. This could be reasonably legitimate reasoning.  
The situation has a significant similarity to the ongoing investigation about the  
Leopoldino historical records they had sent to us with what was left was not known, according  
to officials from the Department there, and to those very public records.

It also is relevant to new evidence to the fact of the disclosure from the  
Balkan side to indicate that the same records were sent via Robert D. ~~WILLIAMS~~  
Gardiner. To the same open public, in substance and on the balance discredit his attribu-  
tion to which was concerned an count-to-count 40 plus in the original program.
