Attached is 62-109090 Not Recorded of 1/29/64. It relates to Albert Jenner, who was a senior counsel for the Warren Countasion and since then has been very much of a public partisant. (Not partisan enough to keep a Chicago TV appointment to confront se in January 1967 but partisan enough to be on many other TV shows and often in the papers.) Jenner is also a public figure in other ways.

'n page 2 there is reference to "100-3-70-1199 - Hemo Scatterday to Rosen, 12-29-63, "President's Commission, Assassination of President Kenned,"

While it would be surprising if the PBI were so overt in its expression of belief that it actually had an "internal security" file on the President's Commission, the fact is that the record cited is from its caption quite revelant, whether or not there are other relevant records in that file. It has not been provided.

Whether or not there are other mixer relevant records in the cited or other 77 files I do not know.

Those on Joseph A. Ball and Hornan Redlich would be quite relevant because of the considerable controversy about them. Only a scattering of the known relevant records are in the Commission file.
