To Cain from David Halberg JHK communication records appeals 8/4/80

Criminal Division records sent 7/25/80

Records referred to but not provided or accounted for.

Indices and diary exist but are not provided.

(Jim Garrison's "Soliman.")

Civil Division records not provided.

MEMO records not provided

N.O. P.O. records not provided.

Attached as my appeal in my today's letter to the Criminal Division pertaining to what it sent me under date of 7/25/80.

As you can see there are references to a diary and an index not provided or in any way accounted for.

There are pertinent Civil Division records it has not provided. (Has it provided anything at all?)

Once again a large number of records are not provided but are indicated as existing from what is provided. More than three that were noted would be routing slips.

While with as large a volume of records verification cannot be depended upon, I have no recollection of any MEMO or N.O. record/referred to pertaining to the tape, # 1064. In the absence of the record noted by that title one is left to conjecture, but it does appear to be probable that the origin was the JHK and in the JHK, N.O. files also would appear to pertain to my investigation of Garrison's purchase of a home and his debt.

Reference to this tape includes on that in the JHK name I was not provided with any transcript of my Garrison phone conversation but part of one was provided in MEMO records. I mention this to provide you with additional leads pertaining to continued withholdings from FBI N.O. records, a matter on which the Department's time is standing out.

The Department has disclosed a deal with a former New Orleans policeman, who arranged to tape phone conversations with Garrison and was used for several times he met with Garrison. That person also was arranged for me to use one of the taped phones when I was asked to make a radio broadcast by phone. (Remember my PA appeals, including N.O. ?)

I remind you again of N.O. files not searched, some of which I have identified to you.
