Mr. Tolson telephoned him at 10:00 AM and informed him that Agent E. C. Gilmore had been placed in charge of the investigation. He stated he had been in touch with Gilmore and was advised that Gilmore had been assigned to the New Orleans office. He further advised that Gilmore had been in touch with Agent C. C. Jack Gilbert, who is a New Orleans resident, regarding this matter. Tolson also advised Gilmore to furnish Gilmore at telephone number listed to New Orleans Office.

Special Agent Gilmore, assigned to the New Orleans office, stated he did not place the call and has no information concerning the matter. Berger was a former Sterling employee at New Orleans 21-3-36, and resigned 1-1-3-35, services satisfactory. It may be possible that personnel of New Orleans Division and New York Garrison's office are looking for Berger due to the fact it has been reported Garrison's staff is sending all disgruntled former FBI personnel to interview. New York and New Orleans were telephonically advised by the Director's Intelligence Division on 2-6-36, to stand by for investigation. New York is submitting a telephone card showing forth results of current inquiries with persons on Franklin House, New York City, and New Orleans to control of the company.
