Sabotaging the Bureau is not an NPA exemption

In 62-10960-4707, 4741 and 4743 the key name withheld, disclosed often elsewhere, is that of Gordon Novel. He was a PGI of the New Orleans office. He was as a youth a Nazi, is a criminal and at last report had been charged and convicted of serious crimes.

Ordinarily the identification of an informant is issue. In this case, as prior appeals establish, the FBI disclosed it. Without this it would have been fairly obvious. However, in this case the withholding further PGI detachment from a series of crimes of which it knew and did nothing because its own PGI was involved in them.

One of these was the hoist of a munitions bunker at Houma, La., on the property of an oil company. Another is in what was then stolen for use in CIA-type anti-Castro activity. U.S. Army materials, including grenades and magazines, previously stolen, it would appear, were stolen here and transported to and stored in the heart of New Orleans. Courteous people could have been killed or injured.

It appears that the FBI separated itself from Novel once he reported penetrating Garrison's office. However, relevant as such records are, no such records have been provided from New Orleans, Dallas or FBIHQ records.

Novel was notorious and unpredictable. This provides notice for the withholding of the pertinent file number from the above-cited records, which are not attached. This also establishes the importance and relevance of the file number, including as a means of evaluating the deportability of the records and any political nature reflected. Also, the file number provides a lead for further research and to other unsearched files.

Novel also was engaged in operations against Garrison from which the FBI wanted to detach itself, but he was engaged in them while he was a PGI. He was an early, misleading influence. (Not that Garrison suffered a lack of this or did not provide his own.)

Novel was involved in neutrality Act violations, to the FBI's knowledge. But being anti-Castro and anti-Garrison appears to have been more important to the FBI.

The FBI used reporting on what it attributed to the unnamed Novel as a means of controlling and influencing what others, including in the Department, would and could know. This adds importance to the withheld AD, DAS, ISD and Criminal Division files.
