This is to acknowledge receipt of your letters dated March 28 and 29, 1980. Note that the "copy of some notes Ms. Barrett made" which you said was attached to your letter of March 29, 1980, was not with the letter when it was opened.

Your comments regarding the materials you have received have been noted and will be reviewed with representatives of the Department of Justice. Please be assured that we are making every effort to be as accurate as possible in our preparation of the materials, but because of the volume involved cannot attempt to explain what you regard as inconsistencies or improper use of the exemptions. The Federal Bureau of Investigation's processing of records relating to the assassination of President John F. Kennedy is now being examined by the Office of Privacy and Information Appeals, United States Department of Justice, under an administrative appeal by you. By copy of this letter we are referring your two letters to that office for consideration as part of your appeal.
