Dear Mr. Kleindinst,

You may remember that last summer I filed the DJ-118 form and asked for copies of the various pictures comprising FBI Exhibit 60 in the Warren Commission files. You kindly provided them.

I have just learned that it is considered proper practice to make careful photographs of such evidence as the damage to the President's garments before they are taken for examination. Was this done with these garments? If it was, I would like to obtain photographic prints of these photographs, showing the damage before the removal of samples for examination.

There may have been other photographs that I would like for my study that I have not seen at the National Archives. I am interested in the damage to these garments only. So, in order that I may know what to ask for, I would like to know of all the photographs showing such damage the Department has or to come in, some time at your convenience, and see all such photographs so that I may determine whether or not there are any I would like for my work.
