Herewith I enclose two copies of a supplement to my motion for a summary judgment in C.A. No 2569-70, with attached Exhibit A, a copy of my letter to CIA and a copy of my covering letter to the clerk of the court.

My purpose is as stated, to provide the Government an opportunity to avoid embarrassment. I think it also provides an opportunity to avoid unnecessary litigation, which should serve every interest.

At the same time, I do not want to jeopardize any of my rights, as my letter to the clerk states.

If there is any technical flaw in what I seek, to extend a courtesy to you and your client, I hope you will not undertake to take advantage of me, for I am ignorant of procedures and the law.
