On 9/4/75 I returned a call to Mr. Tom Johnson of the "Dallas Times Herald" in response to his attempt to contact Mr. Kelley at 9 p.m. on 9/3/75. Mr. Johnson advised that he was calling because of information which had been developed by the "Dallas Times Herald" to the effect that Nan Fenner was the Dallas employee with whom Oswald had left the note allegedly destroyed following the assassination of President Kennedy. Further that the note apparently contained language to the effect that if Hosty did not leave Mrs. Oswald alone he would blow up the FBI office and Dallas Police Department. Mr. Johnson indicated that he has obtained this information from more than one source, however, the sources do not indicate that they have personal knowledge of the contents of the note but that they have knowledge that Nan Fenner allegedly received such a note. Mr. Johnson inquired if the FBI would have any statement to make concerning that and I advised him that the FBI would have no comment other than what appeared in Mr. Kelley's original statement on this matter until all inquiries have been completed and the matter considered by the Department.

Mr. Bassett was advised of this call.
