

JFK assassination records appeals

Harold Weisberg 9/1/79

→ Ridiculous "national security" and "privacy" claims; unnecessary referrals;
Files not searched.

Attached are a Not Recorded Serial from the FBIHQ Oswald file and an undated search slip, both of the pre-assassination period.

In the text of the first record, a cable from the Moscow Embassy, the public domain appears to be withheld, the identification of another defector. All such information is public knowledge but if it were not do you suppose for a minute that it was unknown to the Soviets?

This fairly illustrates the FBI's concept of "national security" withholdings - to deny information not to the Soviets but to the people of the United States.

This is an Oswald record, yet the original is not placed in the Oswald file. It is in another 105 file, 81258.

On the search slip this is identified as the "main" file.

This search slip appears to have been inspired by a CIA error in Mexico City in which the middle name became "Henry".

Other listed files from which no records have been provided are 105-124685 (with the added information removed by crooked xeroxing), 65-28939-2546; 100-353496-715, 97-4196-33-10 and 105-82754-A (? because of crooked xeroxing again eliminating content).

These files, in an Oswald search slip, appear to be clearly relevant and to be relevant to the pre-assassination filed office files requests.
