Dear Mr. Bresson,

File 105-126032 on Marina Oswald appears not to have been provided to me.

If I am wrong on this I'd appreciate being informed of it so I can make a further check.

If I am not wrong I'd appreciate a copy of the file.

Some records from New Orleans 100-16926, also on Marina Oswald, were provided. According to the worksheets I was provided with copies of Serials 14 and 15.

In fact they are not included in what was provided. There is no claim to any exemption on the worksheets.

In reviewing these worksheets I note what I may have appealed and by a copy am now appealing if I did not, the claim to b7e for Serial 11, of 10/30/63, from Dallas.

Without having a copy of the withheld information I cannot be totally certain but I more more than merely of the belief that this is an improper and unnecessary claim, more an inappropriate claim in an historical case, to an entirely non-secret method, one that has been common practice since at least biblical days - pretext.

It is within the public domain and has been for a decade and a half that this coincides with a pretext interview by SA James F. Hosty, Jr.

If I am correct in this would you please provide me with an unexcised copy and a corrected worksheet for this file?

May I also suggest that in addition to not complying with the letter and spirit of the Act and court decisions this represents what accumulates into a considerable waste of time and money and is the kind of thing that has needlessly waste the time of the courts and all parties in court?
