

ReBucab 2/14/64 instructed that all individuals who departed from Nuevo Laredo 10/3/63 during the shift following that of ALBERTO ARZAMENDI CHAPA be identified. This has been done and the results set forth in the letterhead memorandum. Since a great percentage of the travelers leaving Mexico at Nuevo Laredo on 10/3/63 departed during the shift following the one in which OS.ALD departed and in the interest of thoroughness, all travelers departing Nuevo Laredo on 10/3/63 on tourist cards have been listed in the letterhead memorandum and leads have been set forth below to locate and interview all of these travelers.

Referenced San Antonio airtel of 12/3/63 listed some of the names appearing in the attached letterhead memorandum and set forth leads to locate and interview these people. The results of investigation growing out of these leads were not furnished to the Mexico City Office and it is not known which of the persons listed in the San Intonio airtel and duplicated in the attached letterhead memorandum were located and interviewed. Offices for whom leads are persons mentioned should ignore the leads so far as these persons are concerned.




If investigation has already been conducted to interview these eight people, leads set forth below concerning them should be ignored.



The Bureau is requested to determine the desirability and best method of conducting investigation in the foreign countries listed hereinunder in connection with the persons identified by the forms FM-5 and FM-8 in connection with each. If it is determined that coverage is feasible, it is suggested that photographs be provided to the agency handling same with the request that the individual, in each instance, be located, shown a photo of OSWALD, and interviewed concerning his knowledge of the latter's activities, travel in Mexico, and departure from Mexico, with particular attention to his probable destination at the time he left Mexico on October 3, 1963:
