

To Gina Shon from Gerald Weddberg King and JFK communication records appeals 3/19/80

Some months ago, when it was first published, I read William C. Sullivan's book. The former assistant director of the FBI says much that is pertinent to many of my appeals in both cases. I therefore began to write you about it, citing what I believe supports those appeals. Other work, particularly the needs of litigation, interrupted me and I did not complete what I started long ago.
